



Regulations for Training Track

The Committee or any authorised official of the club or RWWA, may at any time at their discretion restrict the use of any training ground or part thereof at any time.

Tracks may only be used during the days and hours prescribed by the club, and no horses may be worked during the hours of darkness.

No horse showing signs of any infection or skin disease may be brought onto any property of the Club.

No trainer or authorised licensed person shall permit a horse under their charge to be on property of the club unless that horse is attended by a licensed person at all times.

No dogs may be brought onto any property of the club.

Horses may only be ridden by licensed jockeys, apprentices, trackriders and trainers with permission to ride trackwork.

No unauthorised gear may be used on any horse or be worn or handled by any rider.

When mounted all riders must wear skullcaps and safety vests and footwear as prescribed by the rules and regulations of Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

Thongs and barefeet are not permitted in the stable area.

Horses doing slow work must pass on the inside of the track, and horses wishing to pass them shall pass to the outside.

Horses entering tracks must give way to horses working through.

Horses must be taken anti clockwise to the point from where their gallop is intended to start.

All horses must enter and leave tracks through specified openings.

Horses must not work more than five abreast, or such other number as the Committee or stewards may from time to time direct.

Notwithstanding that the club, nor any person, may have acted negligently, neither club, nor the chairman, nor any member of the committee nor any officer, independent contractor, or employee of the club shall be under any liability to any person for any damage, injury (including death) of or to any person or horse while on any part of the club or while using any facility provided by the club.
